God With Us

A Study of John's Gospel: "Truth and Freedom" John 8:31-47 May 6, 2020

"So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed Him, If you abide in My Word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." – John 8:31-32

I. "Setting Free Truth"

- a. Have you ever heard something that changed the way you thought? Have you ever heard something so inspiring that it changed the way you lived?
- b. The Jews in the crowd believed, but now it required application. (John 6:65-67)
- c. We must all understand that faith in Christ makes a person a "child of God", but *abiding* in the Word and knowing the truth (living it) makes a true disciple of the kingdom.
- d. Christ is speaking about spiritual, not physical or political bondage. The lost sinner is in bondage to lusts and sins (Titus 3:3), to Satan, and to the world (Eph. 2:1–3).
- e. Jesus' truth is "setting free truth." If we believe and act on it, it will change the way we live.
- f. People reject Jesus because they confuse the physical and the spiritual.
- g. You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free, involves knowing Jesus as Truth, who brings a transforming sense of freedom to human life. Truth works inwardly then outwardly.
- h. Why does Christ set us free? What are we free to do? (Free to love and be loved, Gal. 5:14,22-26)
- i. Holding on to Jesus' teaching will bring a knowledge of the truth which will set you free (32).
- j. Remaining <u>in</u> the truth is the mark of the true disciple. They remain <u>in</u> the truth regardless of opposition. (Phil 3:12-13; 2 Tim 4:7)
- k. His Words must find a place in us. (v.37) We must learn the truth about ourselves, before we can learn truth about others. We know who we truly are through knowing Christ. (John 4:29, at the Well)

II. Children of God and Children of Satan (vv.38-47)

- a. Both *naturally* and *spiritually*, two different *fathers* will produce different types of children from their DNA. (ill. *the paternity test*) The Bible speaks of four different kinds of "spiritual children."
- 1. We are born by nature into sin as children of wrath (Eph. 2:3).
- 2. When we reach the age of accountability (knowing right from wrong) and deliberately sin, we become <u>children of disobedience</u> (Eph. 2:2).
- 3. When we put faith in Christ, we become children of God (John 1:12).
- 4. The person who rejects Jesus and prefers self-righteousness, they become a child of the devil.
- b. In Matt. 13:24–30, 36–43, the children of the devil are portrayed as counterfeit Christians.
- c. In our text, Jesus presents the characteristics of the children of the devil:
- d. They will not give place to the Word of God (v. 37). They trust in the flesh (v. 39).
- e. They hate Christ and seek to kill Him (v. 40). They do not love Christ or what He represents (v. 42).
- f. They do not understand the Word, blinded by Satan (v. 43). They are liars and love lies (v. 44).
- g. They will not hear the Word of God (v. 47). His words find no place in them.
- h. The "children of the devil" are not totally immoral. They are self-righteous, religious people who reject full obedience to Christ. They are the ones described in Matt. 7:21-23.

III. Applying the Lesson

- a. Who is your father? What is your spiritual DNA? Are you born of Christ and washed in His blood?
- b. If the truth of Christ is in you, it will be *lived* outside of you. This is proof that you are His.
- c. If you are unsure of who your *Father* is? Say to Christ, "Jesus, I believe You are the Son of God. I want to be free from sin. I want to know and receive Your truth.

For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. - Romans 8:14
